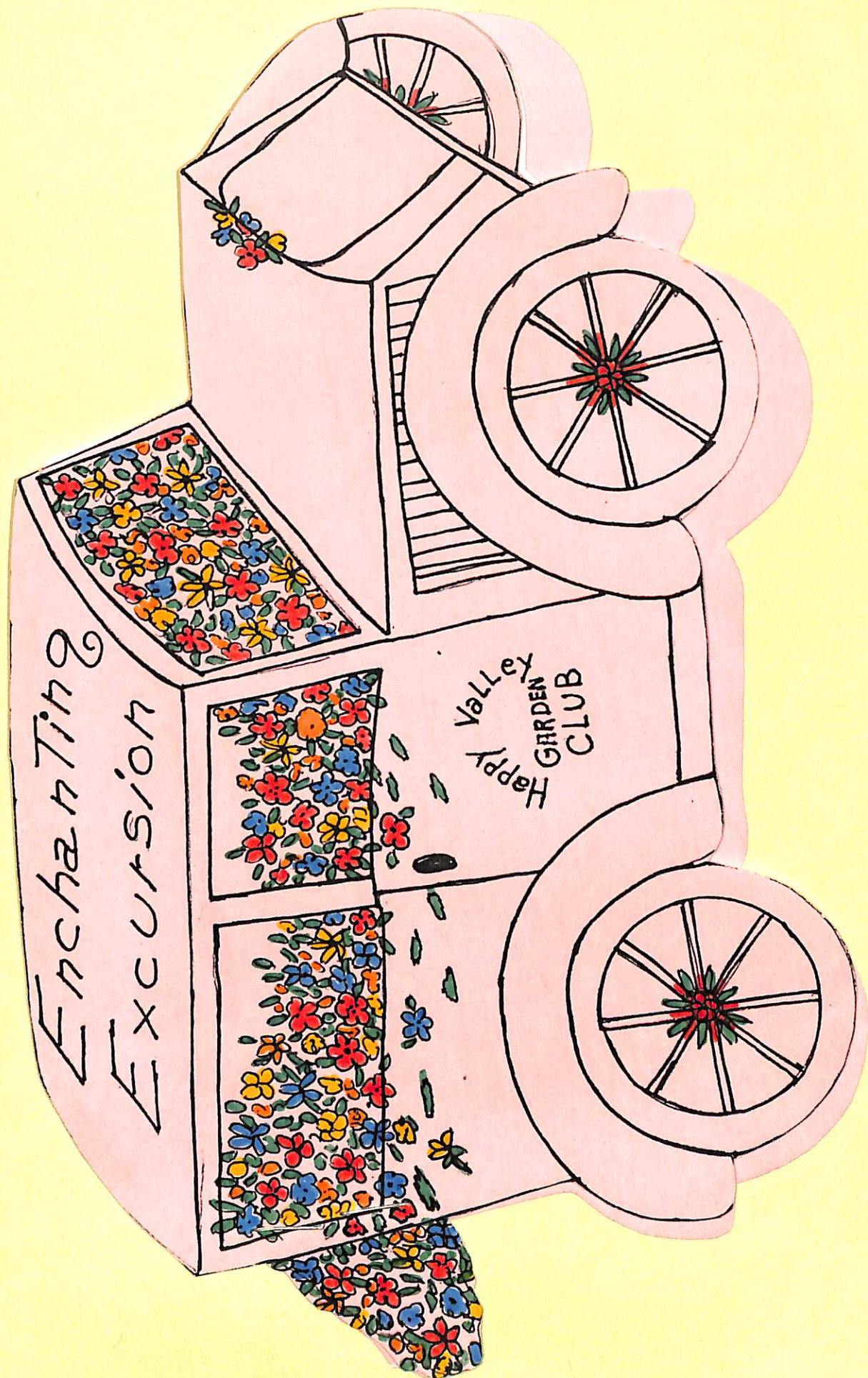

### Show Chairman's Report

This is the first Home and Garden Show presented by the Happy Valley Garden Club since its beginning 10 years ago. Happy Valley is a small, closely knit rural-residential community in a beautiful setting surrounded by low hills on the outskirts of Portland, Oregon. The setting is truly enchanting - hence the name for our tour "Enchanting Excursion".

The show included four gardens, with artistic design classes in each of the four homes and the horticulture classes on the patio of one home. In the driveway of each home on the tour was a sign, a replica of the cover of the schedule, as identification for the public. A map of the area was displayed in each home, with a star marking the location of each of the homes on the tour.

The judges assembled at the home of Mrs. Donald McDonald, the first home on the tour, for coffee before evaluation her garden. Three artistic design classes were displayed here. The first, staged in the formal living room, was titled "Around and About" a free form design which was a challenge to the club members, but they came through beautifully. From this room one looks out into the backyard, landscaped with three terraced levels. A stream originates in the lath house, crosses the yard and falls from one terrace level into a pond below.

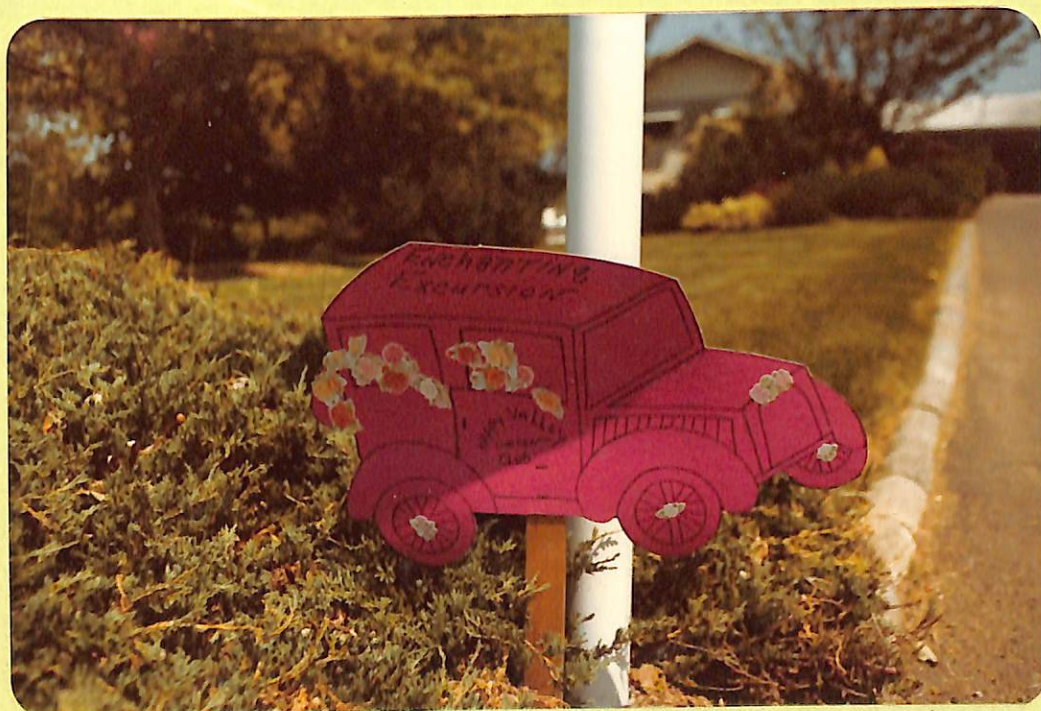
From the living room the judges went downstairs to the family room where there were four arrangements titled "A Day in the Park". On one end of the pool table a large fully-furnished hobby doll house contained four miniature arrangements. This display attracted a great deal of comment from show visitors.

As an educational exhibit, samples of herb teas made from wild plants, specifically blackberries and fir needles, were kept hot in air pots.

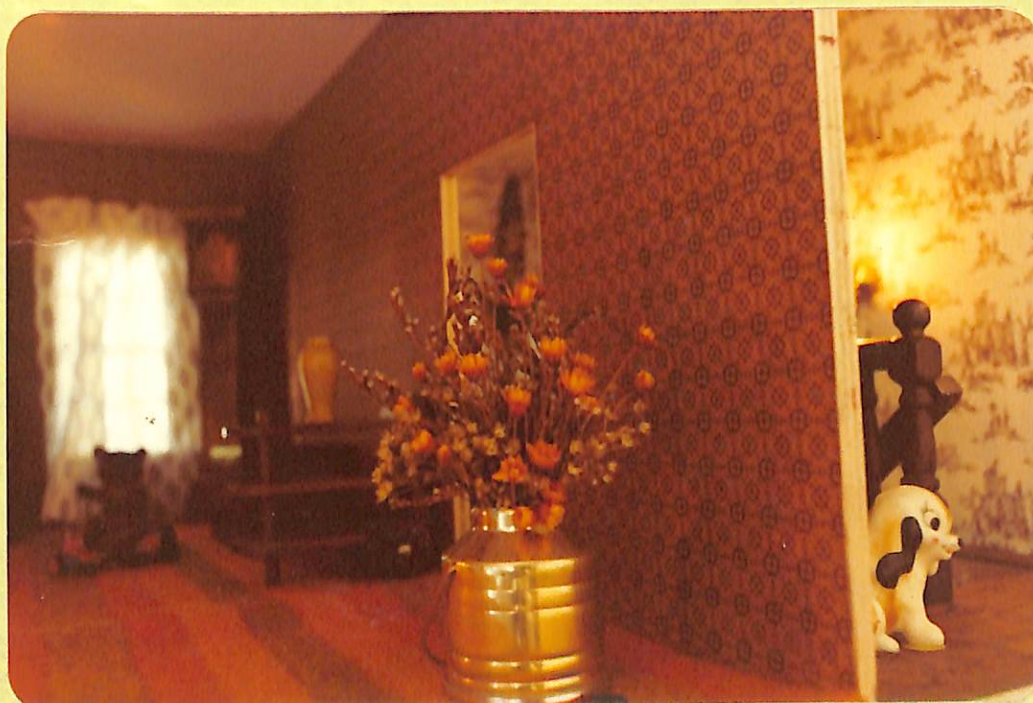

The next garden on the tour was that of Mrs. Edwin Schmidt, whose home also contained the artistic class "Country Gardens" in the large family kitchen.

The horticulture display and four educational exhibits were arranged on the covered patio. The horticulture classes were well filled, with 109 entries from a club membership of 20.

A very informative educational exhibit was done by students from the horticulture department of the local high school, explaining their program and showing common nursery plants and propagating techniques. A valuable exhibit on World Gardening made viewers aware of the activities involved in this project of National Council of State Garden Clubs. There was also an exhibit on drying flowers - showing proper flowers to dry, methods of drying, and ways to use dried flowers. The fourth exhibit was a display on Keeping Oregon Beautiful, as our club since its inception has been active in an annual community clean up drive.

From the patio a walk leads through flower beds, featuring giant rhododendrons, to a large shaded area with a lath house and rockery, and nooks for displaying statuary and curios.

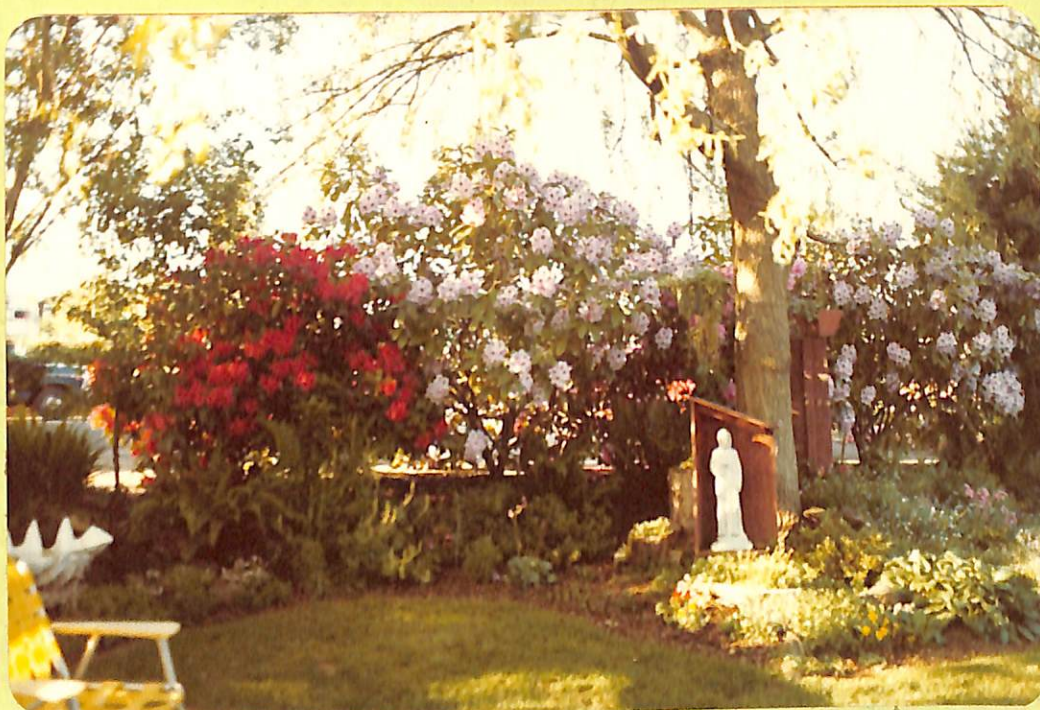

As they left the Schmidt's home, the judges drove through the valley and up Mt. Scott to Mrs. Robert Cockburn's home, where they walked through iron gates into an enchanting courtyard featuring a pond and a flowering quince espaliered against one wall. The tea table was located in the dining room which overlooked the courtyard. Since there is no electric lighting in this room, candles supplied all lighting, suggesting the title "Sentimental Journey" for the arrangements contained here.

"Enchanting View" was the theme of the designs in the Cockburn's living room, which offers a lovely view of the city of Portland. The first place winner in this category was an especially striking arrangement featuring an old college microscope belonging to the exhibitor's husband.
