## How it Works



### 1) Order Plants Starting March 2

Order plants online **starting at 9am on Sun, March 2!** Browse our in-depth plant profiles. Filter by sun, moisture and more to find the right plants for the right places in your garden. At checkout, you select to pick-up your plants at one of four convenient, Portland-area pop-up locations. Order until midnight on Sun, March 30, or until all pick-up appointment slots are taken - whichever comes first!

### 2) Pick-up Your Plants in April or May

We'll see you at one of our **four, outdoor pop-up events** in April or May. Each pop-up event is hosted by a different community partner and a portion of the proceeds supports their important work. Check out the full schedule of partners and locations below!

### 3) Plants for the Planet - Proceeds for the Community!

Your new native plants will enhance the habitat in our neighborhoods and build climate resilience, while **proceeds will support the community partners featured below.** In 2025, we expect to distribute over 80,000 native plants and give back up to \$40,000 to our community partners!

### **Pop-up #1: St Johns on Fri, April 18 & Sat, April 19**

Pick-up your plants in St Johns (Farmers Market parking lot, 8260 N Central St) on Fri, April 18 or Sat, April

19 to benefit the [Friends of Baltimore Woods](#)! Friends of Baltimore Woods is a community organization working toward preservation and restoration of the remnant woodland and green space known as Baltimore Woods in St Johns. They aim to secure this greenspace for future generations as a lasting haven for wildlife, to protect local water quality, and to create an outdoor learning environment that reflects our rich natural and cultural history. Proceeds from this event will help them organize volunteer work parties and propagate native plants for the corridor.
